

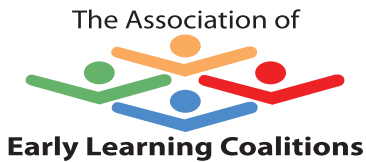

Efforts to educate legislators and their staff about the importance of School Readiness and Voluntary Prekindergarten funding are critical as they move toward finalizing the state budget. Your leadership is needed now to get the word out about the local impact of proposed cuts on the number of children served and the ability for families to remain in the work force.

SCHOOL READINESS

Support the House budget proposal for School Readiness that preserves School Readiness funding and prevents loss of federal funding. The Senate budget proposal includes a reduction in excess of \$3 million in state funding and will result in a loss of an additional \$3.8 million in federal funding. This will result in service to 1,744 fewer children in Florida, jeopardizing their families' ability to work.

Positive Impact of School Readiness services include:

- The School Readiness Program provides significant savings to the state. It costs far less to serve a family in the School Readiness program than it does to provide services in other assistance programs, such as Medicaid, food stamps, unemployment compensation, and temporary cash assistance.
- Child care is a major industry that supports the workforce by employing workers, paying wages and taxes, and purchasing goods and services from other state industries. Florida's child care sector generates approximately \$1.1 billion in wages for Floridians and an additional \$1.8 billion for industries that support child care settings and their workers. Florida's child care sector generates a total value of \$2.9 billion to the state of Florida.
- The School Readiness program allows families to work by providing quality child care for working families. Nearly 250,000 children participate in the School Readiness program allowing lower-income parents to be employed and continue their employment.

The child care industry supports job creation by ensuring parents are able to gain and maintain employment through the approximately 20,000 child care businesses that employ Floridians.

VOLUNTARY PREKINDERGARTEN

Support the House budget proposal for VPK that allocates \$402.3 million to preserve the high-quality programs Florida voters envisioned. This would reduce the VPK per child spending by 1% in alignment with FEFP reductions of .74% providing equity in reductions for education programs while still providing children with a high-quality educational foundation, ensuring future academic success.

The Senate budget proposal for VPK includes an approximate 10% cut in funding per child and increases the teacher-to-child ratio.

Children that participate in VPK consistently perform better on the Florida Kindergarten Readiness Screener than children that did not participate in VPK.

- Constitutionally mandated prekindergarten program, free to every four year old in Florida.
- Consists of quality indicators including developmentally appropriate curriculum, teacher credentials and ratios.
- Program has served approximately 654,000 children since it began in 2005 and is the second largest prekindergarten program in the nation.
- In 2009–2010, it is estimated that the program will serve approximately 70% of all four-year-olds in Florida – 160,555 children.
- Program growth is estimated to continue. Current estimates anticipate the program to serve 75% of all four-year-olds by 2010–2011.

Dear Representative/Senator XX:

Dear Representative/Senator XX:

I am writing to ask for your support to maintain funding for the School Readiness and Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) programs in order to ensure that children can continue receiving high-quality early learning programs, and families can work.

The House budget proposal maintains the School Readiness program funding and includes a 1% reduction in per child funding for Voluntary Prekindergarten. The Senate budget proposal however, includes reductions in School Readiness that result in almost \$7 million fewer dollars in the program (combined state and federal funding) and increases the teacher-to-child ratio, jeopardizing program quality. It also includes a reduction of VPK-per-child funding of nearly 10%, although most areas of the K-12 budget were not harmed or only reduced by less than 1%.

I ask that you carefully consider the implications of School Readiness and VPK budget reductions to small business owners, to children, and to families. I appreciate the difficult decisions the legislature is making this session but ask that you also consider the difficult decisions small business owners and families have to make. The reductions will be damaging to small businesses providing early learning services and to the local economy, and will negatively impact children and families.

Thank you for the hard work you do for our businesses and families in Florida.
