The Early Learning Coalition of Miami-Dade/Monroe is collaborating with Reading Is Fundamental, Inc. (RIF) to deliver literacy resources to Miami-Dade County providers. RIF is the nation's oldest and largest nonprofit literacy organization in the United States dedicated to families and their children. RIF will deliver Care to Read®, an early literacy program that supports the development of children's emergent literacy skills through training and resources, to early care and education providers in Miami-Dade County. The two-day training seminars will be held in Spring and Summer 2008. All participants will receive over 30 book titles and an implementation stipend to purchase literacy materials; the training, materials, and stipend, will all be provided at no cost to those who attend. Approximately 4-6 weeks after the seminar, participants will have the opportunity to attend RIF-led focus groups, where they will provide feedback regarding their progress with the new implementation of literacy activities.

## **Board Committees**

**In an effort to encourage participation, we are providing you with descriptions of each Board Committee's responsibilities. If you are interested in attending any of these meetings or becoming involved, please refer to the Upcoming Events section of this News Alert or check our website at [www.elcmdm.org](http://www.elcmdm.org) for upcoming meetings.**

**Executive Committee:** The Executive Committee is responsible for providing leadership for the Board. This is accomplished by setting policies to encourage effective governance, administration, and legal representation; reviewing and recommending legislative

proposals at all levels of government; and resolving conflicts among committees and between the Coalition and other partners.

**Nominating Committee:** The Nominating Committee is responsible for nominating Officers and Members, and nominating replacement Officers when there are vacancies on the Board.

**Program Policy and Strategy Committee:** The Program Policy and Strategy Committee is responsible for evaluating Coalition programs, formulating strategy, and making policy recommendations to improve the quality of early care and education in Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties.

**Provider Services Committee:** The Provider Services Committee is responsible for addressing the issues and concerns of both School Readiness and Voluntary Pre-kindergarten (VPK) early care and education providers in Miami-Dade County.

**Governance and Bylaws Committee:** The Governance and Bylaws Committee periodically reviews the Coalition's Bylaws, policies and procedures. They are responsible for making recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding policies that provide specific guidance and direction to the Coalition and its leadership concerning all significant aspects of governance.

**Audit Committee** - The Audit Committee meets to discuss audits carried out by outside independent entities to make sure the Coalition is in accordance with State Statutes and Laws as governed by the Agency for Workforce Innovation.

**Finance Committee** - The Finance Committee is responsible for providing oversight of the Coalition's financial operations, for reviewing compliance with Coalition policies, procedures and applicable laws and regulations

**Legislative Advocacy Committee** -The Legislative Advocacy Committee is responsible for working with legislators in order to educate and promote funding and support for early care and education.

The Early Learning Coalition of Miami Dade/Monroe is pleased to announce this year's quality

initiatives for those providers caring for our school readiness (subsidized) children.

We are implementing the following quality initiatives:

The State's Office of Early Learning (OEL) requires all providers to implement a developmentally appropriate curriculum which includes literacy and character development. This year, the Coalition will initially focus on providing curriculum materials for first time VPK Low Performing Providers who also provide subsidized care for children. **Community-wide curriculum training will be available for everyone starting in the month of June.** Details will be sent out at the end of April.

*Providers: If you have been selected for Quality Counts, you will be eligible for materials through an individualized ordering process based on your Quality Improvement Plan. Your Quality Improvement Specialist will provide details.*

## **VPK**

Applications for the 2008-2009 year are now being accepted. Remember if you want to enroll in prepayment, your complete package must be submitted by May 30, 2008. Ensure that the application is completed as per requirements. Don't wait until the final deadline to submit your application.

**IMPORTANT REMINDER: Form 11 - All sections need to be completed. Providers must submit all staff information for "Qualifying Credential" and "Highest Degree," in boxes #11 and #16 using the codes located at the bottom of the first page of the form. In the "Classroom Language" box, #23, you need to indicate the primary language spoken in the VPK classroom. Do not indicate more than one language.**

**VPK Directors** - Anyone that did not obtain the Director Credential prior to January 1, 2007 must now get a VPK Director endorsement. For the endorsement to be valid, the provider must submit to us the following:

- Copy of DCF Director Credential certificate
- Copy of VPK Standards certificate
- Copy of VPK Emergent Literacy certificate
- Copy of the VPK Director Endorsement Course certificate

**New requirement for VPK Directors: Please submit your level 2 background screening with your Form 10 beginning with the 2008-2009 application.**

**Providers Needing Assistance:** New providers needing help with their VPK applications can call for an appointment. No appointment will be made after 2:00 PM. All other providers must make appointments with their assigned Certification Specialist. The staff cannot review your package upon drop off. Please call Liz Quesada at (305) 646-7220 ext 229 to make an appointment.

**Second year Low Performing Providers:** To provide VPK for the 2008-2009 year you need to show you have satisfied the necessary curriculum requirement. Please call for an appointment to meet with Roseline Philippe or Kerry Allen when you are ready to submit your 2008-2009 application. Certification will not process your application without clearance from Ms. Philippe or Ms. Allen.

**VPK Payment for May and June:** As it has been procedure in previous years, there will be no pre-payment made for the months of May and June. Payments for these months will be made when each provider delivers their attendance form at the closing of each month. We thank you for your cooperation.
