

## Job Description

Title: **PART – TIME** Quality Education Specialist  
FLSA Status: Non-Exempt

Department: Quality Initiatives  
Reports to: Director of Quality Initiatives

### Job Summary:

- This is a **TEMPORARY PART-TIME** position
- Duration is to be no less than **6 months**
- **Mon – Fri**
- **0 - 25 hours per week**

Quality Education Specialist is responsible for supporting the implementation of best practices through a coaching model leading to the overall improvement of the Early Learning programs and Classroom Assessment Scoring System's overall composite scores

### Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Ensures that technical assistance services align with the specialized needs of the Early Learning programs.
- Demonstrates knowledge on the Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) tool.
- Achieves and maintains reliability on all assessment tools used by the program. This requires a minimum of 85% on the Infant, Toddler, and Pre-K CLASS tools, as well as calibrations on each tool, as a condition of employment.
- Maintains a score of 85% or above when performing inter-rater reliability checks on at least 2/3 of the assigned CLASS tools
- Build teacher capacity and their understanding of instructional practices as related to CLASS, Developmentally Appropriate Practices (DAP), curriculum, NAEYC Code of Ethics and Florida Early Learning Standards.
- Works collaboratively as a team with other Specialists to develop areas of expertise and provide targeted assistance based on the unique and evolving needs of the teachers.
- Designs and creates courses to identify and strengthen best practices and standards. Communities of Practice (CoP)
- Participates in Communities of Practice Calibration Sessions offered by the University of Florida Lastinger Center for Learning
- Establishes and maintains a trusting, confidential, and non-evaluative relationship with teachers and aligns coaching based on classroom observations.
- Promotes reflection, provides guidance and structure where needed and focuses on strengths and collaboration.
- Ensures high-quality instruction in classrooms through modeling, co-planning, and providing feedback to teachers.
- Informally observes and provides feedback for a teacher's professional growth and students' success.
- Demonstrates the ability to manage multiple projects and deliver coaching to multiple Early Learning programs.
- Demonstrates ability to work effectively with adult learners, especially in the areas of training and application of motivational strategies.
- Demonstrate the ability to provide the support needed by the Early Learning programs while maintaining a professional and ethical relationship.
- Displays knowledge of Department of Children and Families Child Care Licensing Rules and Regulations for early learning programs.

- Displays knowledge of requirements as a mandated reporter.
- Demonstrates leadership in the field through ongoing professional development and participation in workgroups and professional organizations at the community level and/or state level.
- Develops and demonstrates the ability to utilize all technology and technology protocols with Web-based Early Learning System, Quality Performance System, other Statewide systems, and Microsoft office.
- Demonstrates the ability to work effectively in underserved communities, low-income areas, and priority programs.
- Ability to work collaboratively with diverse populations in a culturally appropriate manner.
- Ability to work independently and organize activities essential to the position.
- Achieves and maintains reliability on all assessment tools used by the program. This requires a minimum of 85% on the Infant, Toddler, and Pre-K CLASS tools, as well as calibrations on each tool, as a condition of employment
- Achieves and maintains reliability on the University of Florida Lastinger Center coaching model.
- Participates in Coaching Calibrations offered by the University of Florida Lastinger Center for Learning
- Engage in effective communication in department meetings as well as agency-wide meetings.
- Responsible for providing cross-training to new staff by sharing knowledge and experience through the shadowing process in the field.
- Responsible for the use of an agency paid cell phone device
- 30% or more travel will be required if needed
- Performs related duties as required.

- CLASS Reliable Observer preferred
- Coach Certified by the University Florida Lastinger Center preferred
- 1-2 years of classroom experience in early childhood or a related field required
- Bilingual Spanish preferred
- Computer skills required, including a working knowledge of Microsoft Office
- Excellent communication skills including telephone/email etiquette, listening skills, and the ability to respond sensitively and empathetically to the needs of others
- Ability to work with a diverse population
- 30% or more travel will be required if needed
- Must be willing to travel all areas, as needed, within the South Florida areas to perform required tasks and provide own reliable transportation. Requires a valid Florida Driver's

License, a good driving record, and automobile insurance, as required by the Early Learning Coalition driving policy

- Reliable source of transportation and proof of insurance

**Physical Demands:**
